DUE PROCESS is based on the recent Permanent People's Tribunal (PPT) investigation on War Crimes in Sri Lanka, which took place in Dublin in January 2010. The artists will be responding in a two-hour performance, to the complete audio voice recordings, which convey the Tribunal's final verdict. The Tribunal involved three days of legal enquiry led by a panel of 10 esteemed International experts in the field of human rights, the official transcript of this verdict will be accessible in the gallery. The performance action will gradually develop into an open public discussion, facilitated by Daniel Jewesbury & others, in which the audience will be invited to engage with the concept of people's courts and the findings of this historical tribunal process.
